ADMISSION

Admission Criteria for Regular Acceptance

Admission to the MAcc program is based on a combination of indicators including previous academic performance and three professional letters of recommendation.

Students must hold an undergraduate bachelor's degree in Accounting.

Admission Criteria for Provisional Acceptance

Students with a non-accounting undergraduate bachelor's degree may be accepted as provisional online students. Three bridge courses (ACC 505 Intermediate Accounting I, ACC 506 Intermediate Accounting II and ACC 507 Intermediate Accounting III) must be completed. The program director will determine if any additional prerequisite courses are required. In certain cases, students may also be required to complete ACC 502, Accounting for Management.

English Proficiency can be submitted as one of the following:

- Minimum TOEFL 80ibt (internet-based test)
- Minimum IELTS overall band score of 6.5
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic score of 53
- Successful completion at a participating English language center in the USA
- Duolingo (score of at least 105)
